IT Recycling Project

- This project was set up in May 2020 to fulfil a need, that members had reported, for IT and wifi during Covid. 2 years later we are still receiving referrals on a daily basis. We continue to take donations of PCs, laptops, tablets and smartphones which are PAT tested and wiped and new software added before being reused. Network Meetings and online Cuppa and Catchups

- The Network has been involved in testing the new application form for the GCF and, now that the Fund is launched, will support our members as best we can to help with their applications. We are glad to see that many of the issues with the application process have been improved and welcome the new application support workshops, being hosted by GCVS and GCC, and the aim to improve communications.

Cost of Living Crisis

- Many of our members are reporting increased numbers of people attending pantries, foodbanks and seeking welfare and advisory services across all wards in the North West.

 - Thursdays 10am - 12noon: A weekly Gardening Group with Women's Integration Network - growing vegetables in our new raised beds. These sessions are supported through funding from BEMIS/Dandelion.
 - Thurs 28 July: Let's Get Together social group for the Over 50s - Wellbeing Conversation with Age Scotland.
- We have several events coming up, starting with **Pedal Glasgow G3 on Sat 3 Sept.** <https://www.cycling.scot/pedal-for-scotland/glasgow-g3> - a **Cycling & ReCycling** event.
 - Outside there will be cycling activities; including Pedal Glasgow G3 - a mass participation bike ride from The Pyramid to Glasgow Science Centre and back, Dr Bike with Bike for Good, Bike Marking with Police Scotland, Smoothie Bikes, Play Together on Pedals as well as cycle donations for Bikes for Refugees. Inside we are focusing on ReCycling – there will be a big community tabletop sale in our main space, as well as a clothes/textiles mending workshop with ReJean Denim, junk modelling crafts, face painting and refreshments.

- The centre recently held a BBQ for service users to enjoy and they made the most of the good weather as well as the BBQ funded by the NW area partnership.
- The day centre plays a key role in the charity's provision with service users also encouraged to access other services such as **Befriending, Welfare support and digital services.**

- TVH is now fully re-open, and all groups and clubs are running including the Friendship group
- Citywise ran summer activities for the school children in July and are planned to be back in October school holidays and Toonspeak have been working with some of the children and young people too, over the summer
- Will be running a “Name the Room” competition on social media (when FB is up again) and in the hall. The aim will be to name the rooms in the hall after streets in Townhead area that don’t exist anymore – small prizes to be won
- There is still a continued need for food parcels/deliveries – locals turn to TVH for specific food help. They have also noted an increase in people enquiring about financial and welfare support, which TVH do not currently offer. They have been referring them to CAB and other advice organisations
- Planning to run the “Wrap Up” campaign later this year. This is a campaign to collect unwanted winter coats for the homeless and vulnerable <https://wrapupuk.org/>
- TVH have signed up to be a Period friendly point

- Victim Support Glasgow is fully operational and offering face to face appointments in our office based at Fourth Floor, 177 Trongate, Glasgow, G1 5HF. Our Community office is open from Monday to Friday 9am – 5pm
- Our service is delivered by volunteers ensuring a person-centred approach focusing on each person’s wellbeing, safety, feeling informed and any economic impact.
- Our Court service operates in the Glasgow Sheriff Court and High Court to support victims and witnesses who have been cited for court ensuring they feel informed about the criminal justice process and what to expect when they appear at court.
- Victim Support Scotland also has an Emergency Assistance Fund which is available to anyone who is financially impacted by a crime and has an urgent need as a result.
- Anyone can self-refer to our Helpline – 0800 160 1985 or there is a webchat service

It has been very pleasing to see the growth of a wide range of cultural activities in the area and the return to a degree of normality.

- There have been several events at the Claypits Nature Reserve which celebrated its first anniversary which was a grand occasion with events and activities on the Canal itself. It attracted a large number of residents from our Partnership Area and has proved most welcome particularly for our Partnership since **one of our issues has been the lack of outside space for our residents**. At the same time those members of the Voluntary Sector who have access to facilities have welcomed back an increasing number of organizations. The biggest problem for our area has continued to be **the inability to meet the demand for space** from a wide range of organizations.

- In this respect getting **Woodside Halls** opened and fully operational is highly important. Though the Contracts and Property Committee approved a Licence to Occupy for Woodside on 17th March the process for occupation has still not been completed. It really is urgent that we get Woodside operational by September when many organizations are coming back into full operation.
- We are pleased to announce that our own **Seamore Community Cinema** is back. <https://www.facebook.com/TheSeamoreCinema>
- Normally July is a quieter time for Community Central Hall due to the holiday period and the school summer break. This year we have had unprecedented levels of the number of participants in **Out of School Programme**. Daily attendance has been consistently high throughout. It has created demands on our staff team who have had to bring some reinforcements to assist with unexpected increase in numbers.
- There has been a very wide and enjoyable range of activities including roller skating, swimming, away days to the seaside in addition to involvement in our local community and a five-day residential course with a wide range of outdoor activities and challenges. The young people with staff and volunteer assistance have been cooking from scratch a communal weekly meal. The diversity of the group has led to a huge range of dishes with parents involved too. A major reason for the large total number and the high rate of daily attendance has been **due to all the activities being free and in addition a free lunch**.
- The unprecedented success of the youth programme and the appreciation by families for it, in such hard times, has greatly influenced our strategy and thoughts for the coming months. We will continue to support our young people throughout the hard winter we anticipate. We are also planning an **increased programme for the Older People's Service by providing a range of activities and assistance to help at a time when energy prices are soaring, and rampant inflation in the price of food**. We are therefore anticipating that many people will be unable to afford heating costs and seeking a warm place of refuge. So, providing lunches and engaging them in activities is highly important. Having the extra space at Woodside is crucial. We are fortunate that the building can be made ready for users within four weeks and the priority is to get the water ingress repairs completed. **When we are facing times where our communities are facing choices to heat or eat, it is highly important that, if possible, Glasgow Life properties are reopened to provide a warm place for so many of our most deprived areas of the City.**

Maryhill

- Focus continues to be Community learning, employability and training it has been quieter over the summer period.
- They also have coffee n chat, dancing, football, dancing which are all very well attended.
- They have been working in partnership with Maryhill together and look forward to the lantern parade later in the year hosted by the Burgh halls.
- They are working in partnership with North Glasgow healthy living in their project “Sew amazing”
- They have been working in the environment over the summer holidays and have collected more than **200 bags of litter, weeds, grass etc.** They have 4 active volunteers in Acre drive. It’s helping make a difference they have started to place the planters and have planted a range of vegetable seeds as well as some potatoes. They are pleased with the results as their 1st environmental project and are delighted to have received funding from GCVS for this project.
- They are still giving out food parcels on a Friday afternoon they collect food on a Wednesday and Thursday evenings from both coops in Bearsden this food is given out on a Friday or if anyone messages or calls for a food parcel. **They have seen a rise in numbers over the past couple of months due to the rising cost of fuel and food.** Thanks to funding from Glasgow city council, they have a new purchased a new upright freezer allowing them to collect food share if there are extra evenings.

- Exhibitions have included the Ghost Signs of Glasgow and the exhibition celebrating Maryhill Burgh Halls’ 10-year operational anniversary and achievements alongside Jo Sunshine. Currently onsite is The Scottish Pottery Society’s 50-year celebration along with works by students of City of Glasgow College. To come are exhibitions on the Match Strikes and Bryant and May, Maryhill Is Wonderful (photography), Pride exhibition, Shakespeare Street 100-year celebration, Mary Hill exhibition and possibly an exhibition with Glasgow Vintage Vehicle Trust all scheduled for the next 18 months
- Taking part in Doors Open Days again with workshops, walks and tours scheduled.
- MBHT has been working on the *Year of Stories Project* which will see workshops taking place with the community regarding the story of Mary Hill, culminating with a community day to launch the story and further down the line a launch of a digital format.
- Currently working to pull together a programme of arts and cultural activity to end of March 2023
- Have received funding to resurrect the 2019 Christmas lantern parade and celebration event with workshops taking place with community groups prior to this as part of the Maryhill Together network.
- Official handover of the Maryhill flag will take place next year, with the Lord Lyon attending. Will be accompanied by a community day and funding will be sought from the Area Partnership to support this when a more concrete date is scheduled.
- Work has recommenced on the Maryhill in 5 stories, which will see a short documentary that can be split into small bite size pieces being filmed
- The Cafe will reopen at the Halls later in the year, being operated by an inhouse team

Food Pantry

- Our food pantry is currently on every Thursday 2-4pm and we are currently trialling Friday 2-4pm as well to help widen access to our services. We were also granted Co-op funding to provide a community fridge and freezer which is situated inside the centre and available to all. We had an average of 16 people using the pantry in May 2021 – this has grown to 42 and still rising.

Street work

- Our trained team of youth workers participate in regular street work sessions throughout Ward 12. We cover the areas of Knightswood, Scotstoun and Whiteinch, with particular emphasis on Victoria Park, Fossil Grove, the cycle path, the Avenues, St Paul's Primary and surrounding areas.
- During street work we are engaging with large groups of young people on a regular basis. We use this time to build relationships with young people. We have regular chats with groups and individuals about the consequences of anti-social and risk-taking behaviour. We also explore what the young people are interested in and share info on what diversionary activities we have available. Street work is also the perfect time to discuss our employability support.
- We would like to thank the area partnership for all their support in this ongoing initiative.

Youth Clubs

- The DRC run youth clubs in Yoker Community Campus and Heart of Scotstoun community centre. We deliver sessions aimed at ages 8-11 and 12-19, where young people can access

a range of activities and support, including issue-based workshops, health & wellbeing focused activities and trips, weekly football and cycling sessions, gardening and food growing, and digital learning activities.

- We work closely with young people and partners to develop the activities and services on offer, and to ensure that young people have a safe space in their community to contribute, grow and learn.

North-West Community Pantry 2344 Dumbarton Road, Yoker, G14 0JX

- The North West Community Pantry was established by the DRC Youth Project to provide young people and their families with access to fresh and healthy food at an affordable price. Each visit to the pantry costs £2.50, which guarantees each member a minimum of 10 items (equivalent to the value of around £15). Opening times: Tues 1-4pm and Thurs 12-3pm

Pathfinder - Work Training Programme

- Pathfinder is an award-winning work training programme ran in partnership between the DRC Youth Project and Workingrite. The programme combines the knowledge and experience of both charities to create a unique, holistic employability support service open to young people aged 16-24 in the North West of Glasgow. On Pathfinder young people are individually matched with a small or medium sized local business. This is based on the young person's interests and abilities, and how they will fit in with the organisation. The placement is the core of our programme. Trainees learn on-the-job from a designated mentor in the workplace for up to 12 weeks. Following the completion of a placement we help trainees make the transition from our programme to employment, apprenticeships or further education.
- In 2021/2022, we currently have **6 young people from Ward 12** participating in Pathfinder. 2 young people are in the engagement phase of the programme, 2 young people have started the Pathfinder induction and 2 trainees are currently on placement. 1 young person is on placement with the DRC Youth Project!

- Have 2 services in the area
 - **Crossreach Abstinence Recovery Service** (previously Rainbow House), 21A Westland Drive, G14 9NY
 - 18 space residential service for people in addiction. The rehabilitation programme is a minimum of 3 months although this is personal to individuals needs.
 - We provide medically supervised detox from alcohol or drugs. Recovery Workers are Trauma informed and trained in Group Facilitation and keyworking. We work with the local Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services and take referrals from other external sources including self referrals.



- **Whiteinch Move On**, 13 Victoria Park Drive South, G14 9RN
- 11 space housing support service for people experiencing homelessness and addiction. Support people to appointments, to establish healthier routines, find purposeful activity and address social issues like debt, housing and relationship issues. We support people to access their own tenancy or alternative Housing.
