Anderston City Yorkhill

The Pyramid at Anderston https://thepyramid.scot/

- The Pyramid's Holiday Club, part of GCC's Holiday Food Programme, is in great demand with the daily activity sessions fully booked; additional food bags will be available along with two Family Movie Nights.
- The Zero Waste Shop is being refurbished thanks to a small Scottish Government grant and will re-open after the Spring break, although emergency food will be available.
- The rest of the Phase 1 capital project is nearing completion, including the renovated Sports & Community Hall, Community Kitchen and energy efficiency and accessibility improvements.
- Cost of Living Support project, funded by Scottish Children's Lottery and The National
 Lottery Community Fund continues until June, supporting community members with cash
 grants, food and fuel support, warm clothing and more. There is a huge demand for this
 support. Also supporting several families who are currently accommodated in B&Bs
- The Pyramid is hosting a major exhibition in April STUDIO FLOOR https://thepyramid.scot/events/event/exhibition-studio-floor/
- Sadly, due to lack of funding, we were unable to renew the contract for our Community Builder, Kate Drummond, who was the representative for Anderston, City and Yorkhill. This will result in a reduction in activities and services.

- Daily Lunch Club and Warm Space is operational 5 days per week, with up to 200 visits per week. Providing 2 days of hot meals, and 3 days with home-made soup and sandwiches.
- Glasgow Life are in attendance each week, offering support with CV construction, jobsearching, and advice on further education/training.
- 6 youth work groups are delivered per week; 4 in Possilpoint and 2 in Westercommon Courtyard. Approximately 150 young people attend each week.
- Ongoing demand for support regarding mental health and well-being and food and fuel poverty.

- Litter picks in partnership with schools, local groups, and residents.
- Delivery of a community-growing space at Scaraway Flats.
- Crisis management with food vouchers, welfare advice, debt.

- Stocking up the Community Larder and distributing food parcels.
- Working in partnership with the ARC User Group on upgrading the school pathway, and the growing space.

- Gardening volunteers are attending 3 days per week and working on getting the growing spaces prepared for Spring.
- The Café/kitchen in currently closed due to refurbishment, although the area is operating as a "warm space" serving tea, coffee, and light snacks.
- The Bike Hub is operating, and plans are being made for "led cycle rides."
- Working on the Stockingfield Junction mosaic project with local residents.
- Dealing with gaps in funding, what this means for service provision, and how these can be filled.

- 16 youth groups delivered each week in Milton, Ruchill and Wyndford/Maryhill, engaging up to 150 young people.
- One to one support delivered to young people, as well as Family Support services offering child protection work, outreach services and parenting skills.
- Ongoing concerns with young people's mental health and well-being; many are poor or non-attenders at school, have social anxiety, and display behaviours as a manifestation of trauma/poverty.
- Ongoing discussions with GCC, Caledonian University and local groups/residents regarding
 the new youth and family centre in Milton, along with the future of the premises in Ruchill
 with Glasgow Life.



• Partnership work with local agencies and groups to help support with the Cost-of-Living Crisis: vouchers, community meals, warm clothing, and household items.

Street Work

- Our trained team of youth workers participate in regular street work sessions throughout Wards 12 and 13.
- Our staff cover 10-12KM during each session and pay particular attention to hot spots identified by our team, partner organisations, local people, and councillors.

DRC Group Work Rooms

- We have completed the development of two crucial group work rooms.
- Our first space is a fully functioning Health and Beauty training suite. This room has been a
 fantastic learning space for our latest school's group from Knightswood Secondary. 20+
 young people (who are disengaged from school activity) have been participating in weekly
 sessions with our trained beautician and staff.
- Our second group work room is a multi-purpose space which holds a training suite, with internet access, PCs (donated by NWGVSN) and projector screen plus a partitioned gym



area which young people access to keep fit. The training suite was perfect for sessions we hosted with mybnk and our latest Pathfinder group.

Hillhead

There have been several very good developments since the last meeting of the Partnership:

Community Central Halls https://centralhall.org/

- There has been considerable progress in getting Woodside Hall ready to open. Repairs to make the roof watertight are in process. The Environmental Inspection for the Entertainment Licence has produced a list of required repairs. The date for the handover of the keys to for Woodside is 3rd April and we hope to be completed in time.
- Planning a celebration tea party as a "soft" opening to give residents a look at our Halls and during this event participate in a Community Engagement Exercise on the future use of the Halls and improvements for the area. The Halls will be open seven 7 days a week, on weekdays until 10 pm and later at weekends. The Halls being open for long hours will help to reduce anti-social behaviour and create a safer neighbourhood. The official opening will take place in the summer when the previous users have returned.
- We also had a visit from Susan Grant who is the Community Engagement Co-ordinator for Professional Health and Wellbeing Services for the ARC (the Centre for Advanced Research) which has established a hub to assist community development and wellbeing. They have considerable resources and wish to create a partnership with Woodside.

Local environment and Improvement Fund

- The Hillhead Week of Action which supported the clean-up of the streets around the Byres Road Area has led to a notable improvement in the environment of this part of the Ward.
- Due to our neighbourhood not having a Community Council there had been no consultation at all in Woodside. Only one small repair to cobbles in Clarendon Street and Windsor Street had been included in the designated works from the Improvement Fund. We have been assured that the area will be included in next year's funding.
- After the last Partnership meeting, we had a very constructive meeting with Martin Neill, Neighbourhood Co-ordinator for Hillhead area for Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability.
- At our meeting with the Chair of the Partnership the views which residents expressed of the rundown appearance of the area, poor lighting which made many feel unsafe at night, frequent incidents of fly-tipping and rubbish being set alight.
