



## A New Organisation is born – G15 Thriving Places!

Thriving Places (TP) in Glasgow was set up as a ten-year strategy to be delivered in 10 areas across Glasgow. In Drumchapel, Thriving Places started in October 2016 and on completion of ten years, should terminate in 2026. However, we were informed by GCC that funding for Thriving Places would only be guaranteed for this year 2023-24 which could mean that, perhaps, this could be the last year of GCC funding for Thriving Places. As a result, we created a new Third Sector organisation called **G15 Thriving Places**. We are a collective of four community development workers, who many people already know, Charles Bailey, Michelle Donaldson, Tracy McKenzie, and Ted Scanlon. Our organisation also has a small board of people who live and work in Drumchapel and has acquired the status of a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO).

After five years working from the Chest, Heart & Stroke Scotland (CHSS) charity shop in Drumchapel Shopping Centre, sadly, we will have to move premises. The Charity Shop will continue but without Thriving Places. Neither CHSS nor Thriving Places wanted this move but unfortunately, due to a steep increase in insurance, we cannot cover the cost. We cannot thank CHSS enough for an excellent partnership over the past five years, which has served well the community of Drumchapel. Both CHSS and Thriving Places will continue to serve the community albeit with Thriving Places, now **G15 Thriving Places**, working from Drumchapel Community Centre.

Once terminated this financial year, **G15 Thriving Places** will lead on the future of Thriving Places in Drumchapel. So, this year is a transitional year for Thriving Places, and hopefully, as a new organisation, we will be able to continue the important work delivered by the Thriving Places initiative.

## Infrastructure Fund:

Glasgow City Council has decided to distribute £1 million to each ward for local people to decide upon how to spend the money. We are Ward 14 that consists of Drumchapel, Blairdardie & Knightswood and we will have to organise a series of meetings to decide upon how the money will be spent. We will have to agree on our priorities and needs. The money will be shared with all three areas within the Ward. Once this process is complete Drumchapel Community Council will organise a series of meetings with the community to decide upon how the money should be spent.

The Community Council has been successful in installing the outdoor gym in the park, the covid memorial, and the Christmas tree lights. We are currently working on repainting the railings around the park. These are results of the commitment of local people and would invite anyone wishing to become a part of the Community Council to come forward and take on the commitment of speaking up for the community.

## Our second successful Activate course

Working in partnership with University of Glasgow our second Activate course took place in the Goodyear Social Club from February. 12 local people attended the first meeting with 10 completing the 13-week course and 5 applying to attend University of Glasgow to study BA in community development. The Activate course is an introduction into community development and needs no formal qualifications to attend. Activate is a way of developing community capacity by giving participants the opportunity to reflect on their practice in the light of basic community work values and principles. It builds on the experience of those who work in the community.

# Scottish Refugee Week

16-25 June 2023

A group of organisations, Drumchapel Friendship House, New Hope Community, G15 Thrivng Places & North West Health Improvement Team celebrated Scottish Refugee week with 2 workshops and a multi-cultural celebration. The workshops took place in Drumchapel High School where we shared thoughts about what it means to be an asylum seeker and refugee in Drumchapel today. We used the “We Journey Together” tool which challenges many of the myths around asylum seekers and refugees. We discussed issues which ranged from

racism and discrimination to solidarity with many of these people fleeing from desperate situations. The week concluded with a multi-cultural celebration in the shopping centre area, for the whole community where we shared food, music, and recreational activities. We hope that this week of activities has contributed towards Drumchapel becoming and even more welcoming and caring multi-cultural community. ## Drumwealth Games 2023

The 2023 Drumwealth Games took place on **Friday 9th June** across 6 locations in Drumchapel with approximately 300 local P6-P7 pupils participating in the one-day event. The aim of the Games is to provide young people with the chance to try out an activity of their choice and encourages a healthy, active lifestyle. This year, the event was a partnership between Active Schools, D70, Drumchapel Sport, Glasgow Life, and several other community partners. This was the first Drumwealth Games post COVID. All activities were delivered by local voluntary sports clubs/organisations to encourage and facilitate a pathway for young people into their local sports clubs.

The event was launched in 2013 as part of the local D60 group's programme to celebrate Drumchapel's 60th birthday. It proved so successful that it has continued to date and has become an annual event in the local calendar. We are now 10 years on celebrating Drumchapel's 70th birthday.

Undoubtedly, for the parents, it was a great relief to be able to spend some time away from the house and enjoy a day out.

These outings are part of the Thriving Places Community Connecting Plan which focuses also

on bringing people together, tackling isolation, and building community. Hopefully, we will be able to organise more outings in the coming months.

Friendship House is open to the whole community and meets every Wednesday, from 12 noon until 2:30 pm for a chat and to share some food. Everyone is welcome to come along.
