Network Update

Glasgow Communities Fund Working Group

- The network has been supporting members with a Glasgow Communities Fund working group, where they are seeking to understand the issues the process and decisions have had on organisations and local people. In June, we had a listening event with local elected members, who were on the assessment panel. Our members were able to discuss their experiences of the fund. In late August, we are having an event bringing together local people and members to look at the strengths & issues in each ward with a view of building up a picture of what services are needed in each area. Our goal is to suggest a process that would meet the needs of communities and be a fair and transparent process for Third sector organisations.

- The IT recycling project has now passed it's 1000 donations milestone and continues to take unwanted PC's, laptops, tablets & phones, refurbish them and give them to local people in need in the North West of Glasgow. We also offer an internet dongle with 6 months internet access. The project is struggling with funding and would ask members to think of ways they can support the project to continue.

Anderston City Yorkhill

What are the issues in the ward?

- Cost of living support and advice
- Wide-ranging needs from financial to welfare and health

What are the key issues facing members?

- Rise in people looking for sign posting and advice and unsure where to go
- Rise in people in employment seeking financial support, including food packs and emergency grants.
- Rise in the number of people reporting that they are still in hotel accommodation after one year, mainly refugees/asylum seekers (Pyramid)
- Funding for organisations to be able to support the needs of the community.

General Member Update

- Glasgow ESOL Forum are moving into the Pyramid in September, enabling increased provision for ESOL classes in Anderston.
- Proceeding with Phase 2 capital fundraising to complete the building work, which will eventually generate income and enhance sustainability.
- Currently undertaking a community engagement and consultation process to match services and activities to need.
- Community food shop continues to operate at capacity with growing waiting list.
- Exploring funding options for a dedicated welfare advice/sign posting role, community engagement and activities coordinators

- TVH fully operating with full programme of activities. Café-planning for students from the College of Commerce, supported by college staff to run the café 2 days a week
- Starting a new Beginners computer course in the autumn
- Planning, in conjunction with the local health centre, to start an Autism Peer Support Group for parents, starting after schools go back
- Community Garden – always looking for volunteers for people to potter in the garden with their own projects or to help make the garden suitable for visitors to sit out.
- Continue to be Welcome Space, where people can come in for seat, chat, charge their phone etc as they did pre-lockdown. Continue to signpost to support services as needed – haven't noticed any spike in enquiries
- Recent litter pick with Morgan Stanley volunteers, TVH and GCC resulted in collecting 52 bags of litter (in the pouring rain!)

General Member Update

Woodside Halls / Community Central Halls

- Community Central Halls are now able to plan for reopening the Woodside Halls. The Entertainment Licence for the Halls has been finally granted. For the last month the staff of Community Central Hall had started the commissioning process of the Hall for opening.
- CCH has been appointing additional staff for the Halls in phases. With the opening of Woodside and the expansion we are creating 11 new permanent jobs for the locality.
- We will be holding a “soft opening” when our anchor tenants have all moved in. This event will be aimed at inviting the local community to see the halls.
- Later this autumn we will have the Official Grand Opening of the Halls. We are very grateful for the co-operation of Queens Cross HA in offering to us the use of their empty space beside the Halls which finally provides space not only for the bins but a small garden.
- Breakthrough Summer Programme ran for 7 weeks from June through to August.

Byres Community Hub and Clarice Pears Building -

- As Chair of the CCH I have received an invitation from Glasgow University for the official Opening on 12th September of the Clarice Pears School of Health and Wellbeing which also encompasses the Byres Community Hub. It has interactive exhibits and has already held several events for the wider Community. Their intention is to provide for space for the Community and in particular educational events.
- Susan Grant, the co-ordinator of the ARC has visited CCH and Woodside with a new to long-term collaboration and the Voluntary Sector has already contributed to the ARC’s exhibition and held a Network meeting there. We are looking forward to working with the ARC to develop programmes which we will assist the residents of one of the most deprived areas in the country.
- Doors Open Day programme running 11th- 17th September.

What are the issues in the ward?

- **Cost of living**- especially with gas prices- one man lost his job he just secured because the business he was working for their energy costs have gone from £10k to £50k a year, so can no longer keep him on.
- People mostly looking for help with food and gas money.

What are the key issues facing members?

- Cost of living – especially food and energy
- Drug Overdoses –One plot holder lost an 18 years old nephew to an unidentified drug overdose. The Police are saying there is a rise in these cases. We know of 5 close friends living in Clydebank that have also died due to unidentified drug overdoses. There is local talk about fentanyl being here. This does not just kill addicts but also youth experimenting! You can get Narcan or Naloxone kits from our local pharmacies that could save someone overdosing. You phone ambulance first and then administer Narcan that gives you an extra 20 minutes.

General Member Update

- **Annexe Communities Yunity** project continuing summer of free Community events. Mansfield Park event on 22nd July was attended by over 300 people.
- Two similar free events in ward 12- Thornwood Park- Thursday 10th August and at the harbour Saturday 19th August 2023 1pm-4pm developing links between Partick, Thornwood and Harbour communities. Thank you to Ward 23 and 12 for funding
- Partick John Muir Group secured participatory budgeting funds to pay for their John Muir awards ceremony on 17th August in the Oran Mór john muir suite. Partick John Muir Group is now constituted and awaiting bank account. So look out for funding applications from this group!
- Good news on the funding support- Scottish Government funding Annexe Communities to fulfil a 3 years social prescriber post and Participatory Budgeting Partick and Thornwood Ideas fund for a further three years. Two years Lottery “Let Partick Flourish” funding has been secured to continue the Yunity work. Applied for 3 years got two, delighted in this current difficult funding climate.

- DRC have increased the frequency of street work in Ward 12. Our trained team of staff engage with young people on the street, covering Whiteinch, Scotstoun and Yoker with particular focus on Victoria Park, cycle path, the avenues, Earl Street, the Clydeside, and Speirshall Close/Terrace
- We run free BMX sessions on Friday nights 6-8PM at the pump track outside Glasgow BMX Centre, with young people being able to borrow a bike and helmet to ride the track for the evening. This was born out of a 6-week programme in 2021 aimed at reducing anti-social behaviour in the area surrounding the pump track and has continued to bring in 15-20 young people per session.
- Our work training programme 'Pathfinder', ran in partnership with Workingrite, is currently taking referrals. Pathfinder is a unique, holistic employability support service open to young people aged 16-24 in NW Glasgow. On Pathfinder, we find local businesses who are willing to support and mentor young people while on placement (which lasts up to 13 weeks). Young people earn up to £100 p/w on placement (plus travel costs) and access essential training, accreditation & support
- Due to need and with the ongoing support of the area partnership, we continue to strengthen the work we're doing in the local area. We are in the process of securing a space in The Whiteinch Centre where we will host a youth club/ training suite/ office space which will offer ongoing support to local young people.
- New STRIVE initiative aims to facilitate a personal development programme targeting young people who are in danger of substance misuse or partake in the use of drugs and alcohol regularly. It also aims to provide support, advice and guidance on employment, training and career and personal development for the young people. 8 young people are currently participating in weekly 1-2-1 and group work sessions

North-West Community Pantry <https://twitter.com/NorthWestPantry> Run by DRC Youth Project

- From April to date the Pantry has supported on average 58 families and individuals per day, with around 1190 bags of shopping going out to the members of the community. Active membership sits at more than 250, with around 60 being consistent weekly visitors.
- The popularity of the shop has grown over the past 2 years, with a queue forming before opening hours every Tuesday.
- The shop has provided a platform for volunteering and employability for young people, with 9 volunteers over the past 6 months gaining new skills while working in the shop.
- The Pantry also works closely with NHS Health Improvement Team's Thrive Under 5 project, Kingsway Community Connection, Glasgow Council for Alcohol and Govan Community Project to support members of the community in financial crisis.

- Whiteinch centre recently completed renovations.
- Following on from the community consultation, is looking to set up groups & activities that the community have asked for; these include re-opening a community cafe, health and wellbeing sessions, working closer with existing tenants and generating income through lets to keep the centre operating.
- Community Pantry continues to run weekly and averages 30-45 visitors.
