Anderston City Yorkhill Ward 10

What are the issues in the ward?

- Community members have stated Mental health and wellbeing as their main issue.
- Potential increase in cost of living over winter months.

What are the key issues facing members?

- Capacity to both fund and run needed activities and services.

- The Pyramid recently undertook a community consultation with 138 community members of all ages, looking at 9 key priorities for Anderston. The community reported that their key priority was overwhelmingly mental health and wellbeing, followed by learning new skills/employability and getting active. Children and young people also reported that protecting our planet was a top priority.
- Consulting with partners to identify gaps and strengths in provision in Anderston, also to be detailed in our final report. Final report and findings to be shared soon.
- Are recruiting further part-time and temporary (6-months) support for events and the community shop to boost capacity.
- Held their October Holiday Club, 268 meals handed out and a range of activities offered.
- Anderston Loves Christmas is Friday 8 December as part of their wider Winter Festival and recently received funding for a new community cinema project, programme to be announced in due course.

Hillhead Ward 11

What are the issues in the ward?

In St Georges Cross/ Firhill/ Woodside neighbourhoods:

- Lack of amenities and low access to broadband and IT Equipment
- Large elderly population – loneliness and isolation
- Due to Woodside area having a period where they didn't have a Community Council, it's felt this area missed out on consultation around the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Fund.

What are the key issues facing members?

- Area around Woodside Halls neglected and in need of improvement of the environment.
- Disproportionate cost of parking and restricted for all 7 days until 10pm compared to Byres Road area which has free parking in the evening- impact on attendance at events in the area and for workers and residents in the area.

Woodside Halls

- At last Woodside Halls will welcome its first user on Tuesday 31st October, it is fitting that they were a regular user of the halls before the pandemic. Woodside Halls is excited to be welcoming both previous and new users into the premises.
- For the first weekend of the opening, 28-29 October, Woodside will host its first National Conference of the new era.
- Bookings for future events are at a very promising level. Weekend events throughout November include the Scottish Family Party National Conference, the Liberal Democrats AGM, Scottish Grappling, Christmas Elf Schools for 3 Saturdays and Vivace Theatre.

- There is an influx of young people from throughout the North-West meeting en masse and moving together between the areas of Yoker, Scotstoun and Whiteinch. DRCY team of trained street workers are out speaking to young people where they choose to congregate to gain a greater understanding on why groups are gravitating towards these areas. They are targeting these groups, spending time getting to know the young people and finding out what they are interested in. They are also spreading the word about their initiatives and the meaningful support they can offer.
- Have secured a new learning space in The Whiteinch Centre. This space will be multi-functional, acting as an office space, training suite and the base for a new youth club for young people aged 8-11. This club will focus on early intervention, providing young people with a positive alternative to any ongoing issues in the local area. During club time they deliver drop-in and structured sessions where young people can access a range of activities and support, including issue-based workshops, health & wellbeing focused activities and trips, weekly football and cycling sessions, gardening and food growing, and digital learning activities.
- Continue to run free BMX sessions on Friday nights at the pump track outside Glasgow BMX Centre, with young people being able to borrow a bike and helmet to ride the track for the evening.
- Actively involved in planning one of two upcoming Your Voice events, in partnership with the North-West Youth Network. The event will take place in February at the Yoker Community Campus and young people and organisations from throughout NW Glasgow will attend.

Pathfinder Workingrite in partnership with DRC Youth Project <https://twitter.com/workingrite>

- DRCY partners with 'Workingrite' to deliver their successful and widely respected employability programme 'Pathfinder'. Workingrite have now relocated to their new office in Whiteinch. Both organisations working together on Pathfinder in Ward 12 can act as a further boost for young people and businesses in the local area.
- Pathfinder is a unique, holistic employability support service open to young people aged 16-24 in NW Glasgow. On Pathfinder, we find local businesses who are willing to support and mentor young people while on placement (which lasts up to 13 weeks). - The North-West Community Pantry continues to be well used by members of the public from throughout the NW Glasgow, with 7 families from Ward 12 actively using the shop. More than 1300 bags of shopping have gone to families since April 2023.
- The shop currently opens to the public two days per week, with referral support coming in from partners at NHS, Kingsway Community Connections, Glasgow Helps and Glasgow Council on Alcohol.
- The shop also continues to provide a platform for local young people to gain work experience, with 12 young people having volunteered their time since April, 5 of whom have been supported into the Pathfinder programme or directly into employment.
