#### Key Themes across North West

- The main issue members are facing is the continued effects of increases in the cost-of-living. Especially as we head into winter months, members report increased numbers seeking food and fuel assistance.
- This increase in demand has unfortunately come at the time when our sector is facing a funding crisis with Statutory Funders, Trusts & Charity funders all reporting reductions in funds available. This, coupled with cuts to the Education Budget and public services being reduced leaves local organisations extremely concerned. At a local level members hope they can continue to serve local people and support them through crisis and well as prevent issues from recurring.

## Garscadden/Scotstounhill

### What are the issues in the ward?

- Increased demand for services – impacting capacity
- Funding
- ESOL provision
- Youth provision – especially in and around the Kingsway Estate for older teenagers
- Planned move from Biometric Residents Permits to E-visa's
- Cost of living – see update below

### COST-OF-LIVING UPDATE

- Increased foodbank referrals – due to increases in bills, household budgets, members are noting an increase in foodbank/pantry referrals. Worryingly, in-work poverty is at an increased rate.
- Increased fuel poverty – members are noting an increase in people requesting support with fuel bills and prepayment meters.
- Increased digital poverty – particularly sim cards and repeated requests by those being supported.
- More people presenting as being sanctioned by Benefits Agency

With the needs of the community increasing and becoming more urgent, demand for services has continued to grow exponentially. Members are noting a real concern going into the winter months, as demand will only increase, putting more strain on a sector that is already stretched to the max. The recent changes announced to winter fuel payment for pensioners remains of concern.

### General Member Update

- **DRC Youth Project** - We thank the area partnership for their ongoing support. The extra funding from our most recent application was a much-needed boost for our project and strengthened our ability to offer the most vulnerable young people in our community access to a range of diversionary activities. Our original plan was to deliver activities at our new sites in the Yoker Allotments and Yoker Sports Hall. Unfortunately, we had to diversify our plan due to issues and unforeseen delays outwith our control. While we were able to do small pieces of work in the allotments, without access to the sports hall, we were unable to deliver activities there. We're confident these issues will be resolved soon. In the meantime, we're staying positive, working hard and doing all we can to support the hardest to reach young people in our community. See Victoria Park for more info on DRCYP's work
- **Active Seniors** – Trip to Troon enjoyed by 53 members and a social afternoon attended by 90 people. In partnership with Generations Working Together members are looking at multi-generational community safety.
- **Kingsway Community Connections** – Successful Harvest festival with over 600 community members attending. Breakfast club, over 30 young people attending each day. Christmas open day planned for 20th December and Santa will be dropping by on 19th December between 3pm and 5pm. The Centre will close on Friday 20th December and reopen Monday 6th January.

- **DRC Generations** – Continued delivery of Advice drop-ins, 1-1 support and informal support sessions.
- **Knightswood Community Centre** – Community cinema continues to be popular and well attended. A community garden has been developed, this growing and recreational space is a welcome addition and included a number of raised beds.
- **Glasgow Eco Trust**
- **Community led-transport forum** - the first one was held at HoS on Tue 22 Oct with 30 people representing 14 organisations in attendance. Next Forum is scheduled for Thu 5 Dec at Knightswood Community Centre (230-430pm). We will be establishing a women's working group and we have been supporting the Liveable Whiteinch group of residents as well. - **Bike referrals and bike repairs** - through funding from Cycling UK Access Bikes fund we are able to support people with the cost of bike repairs (up to £100) and to provide a free bike and essential accessories via referrals from local partners
- **De'ils On Wheels** - open for sales of refurbished bikes, bike repairs and donations of unwanted bikes
- **DRC local network** - continue to facilitate a monthly online network for local organisations to connect and share info and issues

### What are the issues in the ward?

- In our area the major concerns of the community have continued to focus on the cost-of-living crisis and the poverty endured in the particularly from Queens Cross to St Georges Cross right down to the border with the start of the City Deal improvement area.

### What are the key issues facing members?

- Funding uncertainties for organisations

### General Member Update

- The current crisis affecting the funding of Local Authorities could affect directly parts of the Area Partnership. Having missed out entirely on getting funding from the £1m fund for the improvement of the Ward last year it is unlikely that there will be any such funding available this year. The area around St George's Cross particularly Woodside could have benefitted immensely from an improved environment for the residents as many of whom are elderly.
- Funding uncertainties impact on both service users and providers. Nevertheless, the organisations in the area continue to maintain services. The need for these services has been reflected in the number of users continuing to increase.
- **Community Central Hall** <https://centralhall.org/>
- CCH has waiting lists for both the Happy Days Nursery and Safe 'til Six which is partly due to other providers closing or becoming purely commercially based. CCH continues to have a Partnership Nursery and affordable prices for all childcare.
- On a brighter note, CCH is at present refurbishing the Breakthrough Youth Services Zone.
- We are also expanding the services of the Community Fridge to encourage greater engagement with our regular users. We are planning to introduce a Money Advice service which will operate within a new café setting of the fridge which will encourage our users to enjoy meeting up in an informal and stigma -free atmosphere.
- **Woodside Halls** has been very busy with events. CCH of course in November will be hosting the ballot station for a bye-election.
- This year again we will have two pantomimes taking place in the Reid Hall and the other is Woodside.

### The Coach House Trust

- Continue to offer workshops in Art, Music, Gardening and IT
- Took part in Glasgow's Doors Open Day on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September, with a good number of visitors to the centre.

### Flourish House

- Gearing up towards the Christmas Period, including Christmas Day festives. Will be looking for support and donations from local businesses and organisations to give the members a special day.
- Worry and fear amongst service users around the future of community based mental health services. Glasgow City is planning to reduce in-patient beds and at the same time explore a Patient Initiated Follow Up model for mental health.

- This work is supported by the NWGVSN and partly funded by the area budget.

- Cooking Skills – A weekly simple meal is cooked by the **Cost-of-Living** class and we all sit down and eat together. Recipes, ingredients, tips, cooking and otherwise, are shared.
- **Social prescribers** from doctors – over 100 people have been referred by their Doctors to the Annexe where Social Café, Friendship Club, Annexe Café can be starting points for people journey back to themselves.

#### Partick Housing Association

- PHA emergency food and fuel support fund. Thanks to AP funding PHA have set up its emergency food and fuel support fund. The fund covers 2 days emergency food pack, a cosy pack and fuel vouchers, £30 in summer and £50 in winter.
- Cost-of-Living issues impacts 37 tenants needing support in total 31 emergency food packs, 8 fuel vouchers (this only became available again from August 2024)
- The plan is for this fund to be available long term and be funded through PHA procurement contracts to form the new PHA Community Development Fund.
- **Beith Grove Garden** :PHA Sent out 350 letters and emails to local residents and held three 2hr consultations plus some door knocking. Very positive response so far. Working with Kate from Clydeside Garden and Mary from the Bee Garden. Plans now being drawn up target National Lottery Heritage fund to cover project costs, staff and maintenance

#### Streetwork and Diversionary Activities

- Our street work team are out engaging with young people where they often choose to socialise, talking about what matters to them and why. During street work sessions we build relationships with young people, chat about risk taking behaviours and focus on the consequences of these actions. We also highlight the support, initiatives, and activities we

offer. We thank the area partnership for their ongoing support in offering young people in the local area alternatives to hanging around the streets on the nights we don't operate youth club services. The boost in street work and diversionary activities has not only been beneficial and educational for the young people involved but has also given the local community some extra respite and reassurance as well.

#### **DRCYP working in partnership with Victoria Park Community Trust**

- DRC are working together with VPCT members on a youth consultation with young people from Whiteinch and the surrounding areas. The consultation focusses on what young people would like to see in their local green space, with the aim of delivering on the outcome of the consultation, something that will increase the number of young people visiting the park. The DRC Youth Committee played an active role in the consultation and are open to supporting the development and delivery of a proposed youth event in Spring next year. This project was funded by WSHA Community Project Fund.

#### **Mybnk – Personal Money Management**
